
Monthly Photography Themes

What's the latest in the gardens?


Formal Garden

Well, it would be nice to tell you that we are getting on well with the formal garden, but this rainy weather is now beginning to heed progress. In between the downpours we have managed to get on with some of the weeding, but the soil is very wet, and it really doesn't pay to keep walking on wet soil as it compacts it too

much.

For those of you that regularly walk through the garden you will notice we are trying hard to remove the bulbs form the beds. These were not in the original planting plan and have simply been left in the soil from when it was a wooded area. We are replanting these bulbs in designated areas for you to still enjoy.

With this mild weather comes weeds and knocking them back now should mean we may be on top of them come the spring.... Well that's the plan.





Kitchen Garden

It is starting to look really nice in the kitchen garden with organic matter and bark chippings demarcating the paths. You can see that the Autumn sown onions, garlic and shallots have put on a great deal of growth this past few weeks. Although that bout of snow would have given them a shock!



We have started some peas and mangetout off in modules as the

pigeons had a great munch on the first lot. The potatoes are chitting and will be ready to go out by the time I write next month's newsletter.

The cut flower patch is underway as the first wave of seedlings are about to be pricked out. These include hollyhocks, ornamental



grasses, sweet peas, zinnias, cosmos, foxgloves to name just a few.



Our school groups have been busy writing labels for their Dig for Victory bed and the chicken run is now complete and will go on the bed any day.

You may have noticed our cabbage frames are now completed with a fine mesh, this will help stop the cabbage white!

The autumn planted spring cabbages are putting on healthy growth now and will benefit from a feed in the next few weeks.
