
Monthly Photography Themes

What's the latest in the gardens?

Happy new year to you all!

We are extremely excited to begin the year with some new volunteers in the group: Heather, Linda, Irene, Denise and Paul. We hope you will enjoy the experience and become a regular part of the garden team.

So where to begin?

The start of the year has continued to be extremely wet underfoot, so we have been turning our attention to the kitchen garden as our predetermined paths have meant that we are not disturbing the soil structure.

We have given the soil a light dig over and then a generous covering of manure. This allows the worms, of which there are plenty, are doing the work for us. This has greatly reduced our weeds as we are not constantly exposing them to the light for germination.



Thanks to Houghton Regis Town Council who have provided us with a

generous amount of bark chippings we have been able to replenish the walkways on the beds so that even in drizzly weather we are able to walk on the beds without getting too muddy.

We have a couple of new beds to share with you this year, bed 7 which was the fairy story bed last year is now to become the pollinator bed which will have a wonderful collection of plants for bees, moths, butterflies and wasps. You may have already seen the great array of bulbs showing their green shoots above the soil. It has recently had a bird feeder added to it and it is already attracting a great variety of birds. This bed will be developed and planned by the

volunteers using a wide range of planting schemes and props. It is intended to be walked around and to be enjoyed once it is in full bloom.

Dig for victory

In order to mark the 75 years since the guns fell silent, we are marking the occasion by doing a dig for victory garden on bed 4. This has been entirely designed by students from Weatherfield Academy and supported internships. It is a way of showing how people across the country were encouraged to grow their food in times of hard rationing. Open spaces were transformed into allotments, from domestic gardens to public parks – even the lawns outside the tower of London were turned into vegetable patches.

We hope that this bed will provide a useful insight into how to make the most of your space, except ours is going to have an Anderson shelter and some other quirky props. By the end of this week the children and volunteers will hopefully have made a fully working chicken run!



Sowing and Growing

Behind the scenes we are busy sowing the crops in earnest. As we don't have the luxury of heated benches and warm polytunnels we are collaborating with our friends and colleagues at Silsoe Horticultural college. They have been extremely helpful in assisting with the sowing plan and already we have good germination of aubergines, leeks, lettuces, herbs and flowers.

And then we must talk about tomatoes. For those of you that love growing new varieties and experimenting you will be pleased to know we have 56 different varieties that we will be sharing with you by having 'Tomato day' at the visitor centre on April 16th. This is where you will have an opportunity to purchase at a

reasonable cost some heirloom, coloured and fantastic beefsteak varieties. Although Jen's tangerine may be in great demand for the name alone!!! More details will be available shortly on the web site.

As we begin to have some drier days, we will turn our attention to the formal garden which is about to have the roses pruned and the herbaceous perennials cut down and if necessary lifted and divided. It is nice to know that the soil has had a good soaking so it should start them off in good stead for the year.

The mild weather has been lovely to work in but the price you pay is the germination of the annual weed seeds already rearing their heads. We will get there, but that's gardening for you; there is always something to do. It just gives us all such pleasure to know as a community and regular park users you appreciate the hours and time given by this wonderful group of men, women and children, and that is the best reward we could have.



We hope that you will enjoy watching the garden developments unfold as we go through the seasons
